Hole 11, Highlands Course

▲ The Club at Nine Bridges - Number 95

Some great courses owe as much to effort and finances as to architectural ingenuity. Nine Bridges is a stunning example of what results when all three collide. Designed by Ronald Fream and David Dale of Golfplan, in Santa Rosa, California, and opened in August 2001, the South Korean course's estimated cost was a staggering \$100 million. Small wonder that Chi Chi Rodriguez described Nine

Bridges as a Taj Mahal of golf. The Club at Nine Bridges lives up to its motto - "Where East Meets West" - by hosting the World Club Championships. There are two nines here (Creek and Highland) and each closes on a par 5, none better than Highland's closer, which winds for 504 yards between bunkers and around trees to an island green.
